Lafayette Village Drive Traffic Study

Dear Neighbor,

There is a speeding problem on Lafayette Village Drive. Traffic studies and resident's comments and concerns support the need for traffic calming techniques aimed at reducing speed to legal limits on Lafayette Village Drive.

After much study and input from the neighborhood, the Fairfax County Department of Transportation and the Lafayette Village Drive Traffic Calming Task Force has formulated a traffic-calming plan for your consideration. The work of the task force has been reported in the Association's Newsletter, and discussed regularly at LVCA monthly Board meetings. A formal presentation was made by the Task Force at the LVCA Semi-Annual meeting in May. This specific plan, approved by the Task Force and presented in the June/July newsletter, and discussed at a community meeting held June 23, represents the best solution to reduce speeding on Lafayette Village Drive, given the options made available to us by the Fairfax County DOT. The plan is described on the enclosed ballot. If you have questions, please contact a member of the Lafayette Village Traffic Calming Task Force before you vote.

- Please examine the enclosed proposal.
- Vote "yes" or "no" as the ballot is printed.
(Please note that ballots that do not indicate a clear "yes" or "no" vote to approve or disapprove the proposed traffic-calming plan in its entirety will be considered as a "non response.")
- Complete and return the enclosed ballot by mail.
(The ballot can be folded in thirds so that Supervisor Gross's address appears and your vote is hidden.)
- Please seal the ballot with tape.
Your ballot must be postmarked no later than August 16, 2010. Only one response per household, please.

These requirements are per the Fairfax County Department of Transportation.

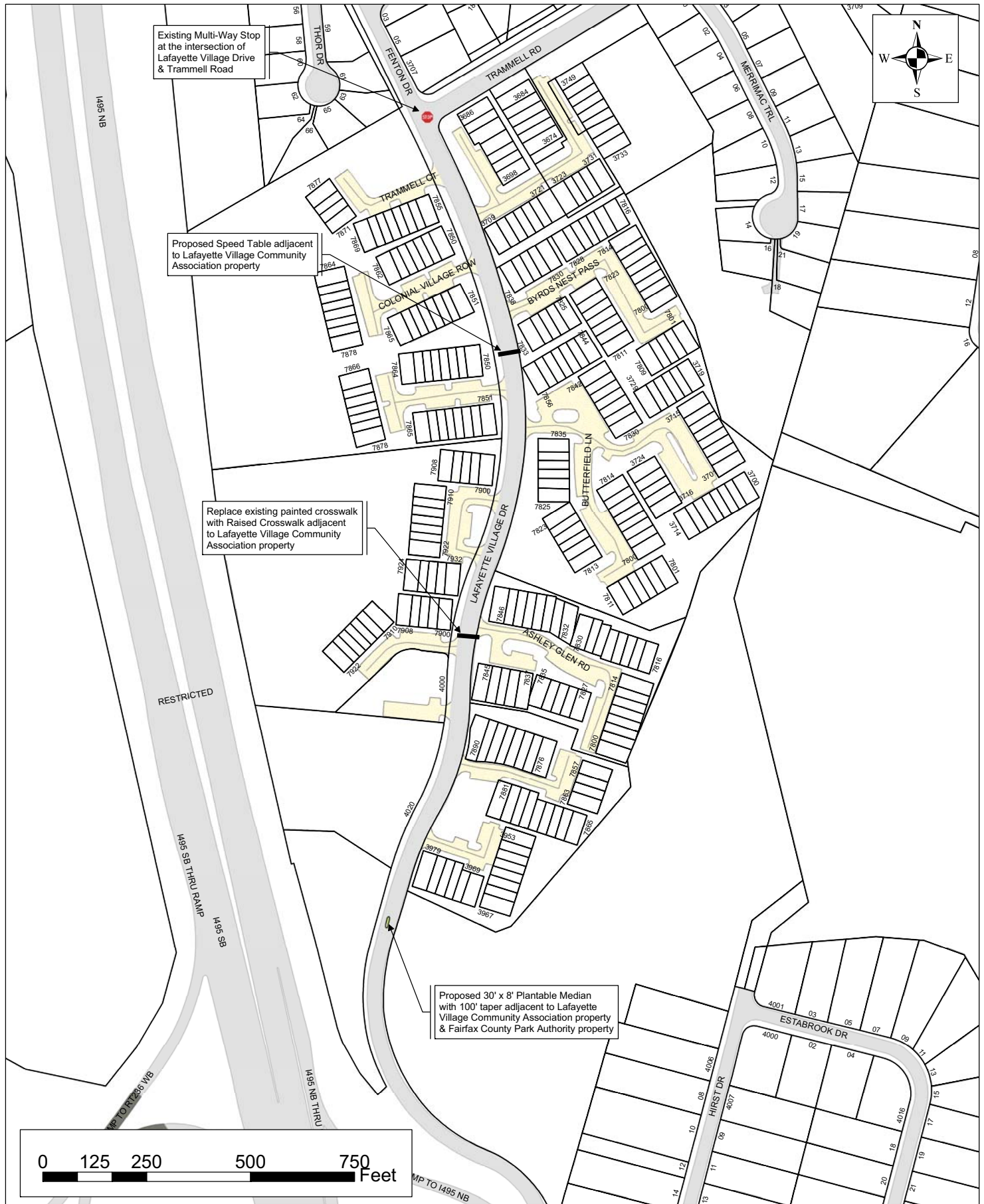

ONE BALLOT, ONE VOTE PER HOUSEHOLD

The Fairfax County Department of Transportation staff have researched carefully and approved the following, all inclusive, traffic-calming plan:

1. One speed table on Lafayette Village Drive, approximately 20 ft. south from Byrds Nest Pass.
2. One raised crosswalk between Ashley Glen Road and Brunswick Forest pass at the site of the existing cross walk.
3. A plantable, raised median island approximate 30' long and 8' wide, 40' south of Hancock Forest Trail.

A map of the proposed traffic calming plan is on the back of the cover letter accompanying this ballot.
